- The Freedom Tour 10th Anniversary. This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Freedom Tour documentary. The film grew as a response to and a rejection of a decision by the Manitoba government to invest millions into a rundown institution that warehoused people with intellectual disabilities. The film documents the incredible journey of 16 self-advocates and friends who travelled across the Prairie Provinces to raise awareness about life in an institution. The documentary portrays compelling stories told by survivors of institutions who had moved into communities across the Prairies. In addition, over the past 10 years, The Freedom Tour has been on a tour of its own.
