Seventh COVID-19 Case Confirmed at Loretto Catholic Elementary School;
Fourth Case Confirmed at Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Elementary School (St. Catharines);
Single Case Confirmed at Blessed Trinity Catholic Secondary School;
Single Case with no Risk of Exposure at Notre Dame College School

Niagara Catholic reports the following four confirmed cases in our schools for this weekend:

A seventh person at Loretto Catholic Elementary School has been confirmed to have a positive case of COVID-19. As a result, students and staff were exposed to COVID-19 while this individual was infectious. Niagara Region Public Health has provided information to the individuals connected with this case, and they are now in self-isolation.

A fourth individual at Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Elementary School in St. Catharines has also been confirmed positive for COVID-19 by Niagara Region Public Health. Students and staff at that school were exposed to COVID-19 while this individual was infectious. Public Health has provided information to the individuals connected with this case, and they are now in self-isolation.

Niagara Catholic has also learned of a confirmed case of COVID-19 at Blessed Trinity Catholic Secondary School. This brings the active case count at the school to three. None of these cases are connected, so no outbreak has been declared. Individuals who were exposed to this person have also been advised to self-isolate.

Finally, a case of COVID-19 has been confirmed at Notre Dame College School. In this instance, Public Health has determined that there is no risk to the school community.

Niagara Catholic advises all contacts to follow the recommendations of Niagara Region Public Health.
