C. AGENDA ITEMS

Chair's Report – Chair Somma

This committee brings together individuals from various units within the board who support accessibility for students, staff, and community members accessing board resources.

<u>Accessibility Multi-Year Strategic Plan (2022-2027)</u>- this is also available on the NCDSB board website. This is the guide developed and provided for all units.

Some highlights include: mandatory training for every employee; retrofitting schools to be accessible, including accessible portables at every school.

New website is being carefully designed to include required accessibility standards and more inclusive language use, readability and accessibility.

Accessibility Awareness Plan- received a \$140,000 grant to further the accessibility awareness initiatives form last year. Proposed a focus on parents and removing barriers for accessibility; targeting the secondary level.

Health and Safety- focus on emergency evacuation protocols for students with disabilities, specifically in multi-level schools; in consultation with Niagara Emergency Services.

GOAL#1

Improve transitions for all students (into school for the first time, from elementary to secondary, from secondary to post-secondary and beyond, integrated transition plan). Action items:

- 1. Holy Cross will invite grade 7 families to their open house later this month (Nov. 30) specifically to target students with special education needs and their parents/guardians): this will serve as an example/pilot for other schools to implement in the future. Adele is requesting central staff personnel on site to offer information and to answer questions for families.
- **2.** Gino's team inquiring to elementary and secondary schools to gain information about what processes they engage in regularly related to transition planning/ tracking and sharing of information between elementary to secondary and teachers.

GOAL#2

Improve/promote access to and knowledge of services outside of the school board and organizations including paraprofessionals and government funding options.

Action items:

Bethesda Services - Alyson Wilson

Bethesda and the Niagara Children's Centre provided service to 87 children across five classrooms through the Ontario Autism Program's (OAP) Entry to School Program (ETS) between March and August.

ETS is a six-month curriculum-based service that helps prepare children to enter kindergarten or grade 1 for the first time. Children received up to 15 hours a week of interdisciplinary group service.

The team prepared Integrated Transition to School Reports that were shared with caregivers and school staff.

The ETS Program also includes consultations to families and educators to help support the child's transition to school throughout the first term. Consultations from members of the Interdisciplinary team are still available. Educators can request consultations by emailing entrytoschool@bethesdaservices.com.

Bethesda will be attending the Open House at Lakeshore Catholic High School in November to share information about funded transition services that are available to youth and their caregivers.

Bethesda offers a variety of different **Foundational Family Services and Supports** that are available to families registered with the Ontario Autism Program or Children's Behaviour Services.

Upcoming Nov. 24 PD Day

Student Support Staff will be hosting all Niagara Catholic Educational Assistants and Intervenors, Elementary and Secondary ERTs and Secondary Special Education Class Teachers for our upcoming PD day on November 24th. Highlights planned for the day include a presentation on Accessibility and Inclusion from the Rick Hanson Foundation. This presentation will provide our staff with a further understanding about the need to build communities where everyone can go everywhere and to be a Difference Maker. We hope this time will further broaden their perspective regarding equity and inclusion.

We are also offering a presentation by our own Board lawyer on this same topic of accessibility and the responsibilities of school boards in Ontario. The day will also include flexible workshops led by our central staff where participants will be making-and-taking visuals and resources to support students with their personal communication goals. We hope these practical workshops will directly support the good work they are doing back in their school.

Select staff will also be working with our Teachers of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing/Blind-Low Vision on specific activities involving *myASLTech* which is a unique suite of assistive technology tools enhancing communication.

Our next Educational Resource Teacher and Special Education Classroom Teacher meeting will be held Nov. 29 here at the CEC. The day will include BMS Training, a presentation from Contact Niagara regarding the services they provide, Jessica from Niagara College again presenting information on the Community Integration Through Cooperative Education (CICE) program, a presentation regarding our SEA coaching module provided by LearnStyle who is one of our close

vendor partners which supports students to use their assistive technology. The day will also include important updates by our central team.

Let's Read After-School Reading Program

The Let's Read After-School Reading Program in partnership with the LDANR is off to a great start with over 50 students participating from across the Board at four different school sites. Eight Niagara Catholic teachers along with an LDANR facilitator are supporting each program with intensive and targeted reading instruction.

Niagara Catholic will be starting the process of completing Psycho-Educational Assessments for students that have been referred by the school and supported by our central team. The process for an assessment is extensive and deliberate so that the best possible interventions are provided to the student and school staff. Pryor Linder and Associates is our contracted agency that will continue to complete our assessments this school year.
